CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Subject: Modern Foreign Languages (Spanish)

We believe that a Modern Foreign Language prepares pupils to participate in a rapidly-changing world in which work and other activities are often carried out in languages other than English. The rise of international commerce means that pupils need to be equipped with the skills needed in the international workplace. The choice of which language to teach is secondary to the lifelong language learning skills that the pupils will be encouraged to develop.

Our KS2 children are taught Spanish by our specialist teacher, Margherita, who comes into school every Tuesday. To supplement this teaching, Ms Greathead, our Spanish Subject Lead, runs 'La Cocina' - a Spanish cooking club! Last week, they made gazpacho, learned the verb 'rallar' (to grate) and the noun 'pepino' (cucumber) and practised their

cleaning skills!
