CURRICULUM CORNER

This Week's Focus: Design Technology (DT)

Within Design Technology, we strive to prepare children to take part in the development of tomorrow's rapidlychanging world. Our DT curriculum is high-quality, well-thought-out and is planned to demonstrate progression. We focus on progression of knowledge and skills and discreet vocabulary progression also forms part of the units of work.

Within a unit of work, we follow a five-step process for DT: children research the product they're focusing on/about an important person in the field they are looking at; they practise the skills they will need to use within the unit, they plan their design, make their product and evaluate its effectiveness. Year 6's current DT unit is Food Technology. Within this

unit they have made a three-course meal with a Mexican theme! They researched Mexican food and ingredients, practised skills for chopping sensibly and carefully using a knife, planned the course they were responsible for, made the course and then **evaluated** it...a huge part of which involved eating it!
